

Creepy Doll Cocktail Party COVID-19 Policy

For the health and safety of our staff, volunteers, and most importantly our guests, the History Center of Olmsted County has decided to require either proof of a full series of COVID-19 vaccination, or proof of a negative COVID-19 test taken in the prior 72 hours in order to attend the Creepy Doll Cocktail Party. We are dedicated to creating a fun and safe environment and given that this event will be difficult to attend with a mask, we have made the decision to protect all of our attendees by requiring full vaccination or proof of a negative COVID-19 test.

What does 'proof of a full series of COVID-19 vaccination' look like?

We are accepting the following as proof of a full series of COVID-19 vaccination:

- A physical card showing a completed series of vaccination that matches the patron ID
- A picture of a physical card showing a completed series of vaccination that matches the patron ID
- Digital immunization records such as Docket or Clear
- Negative test results may be printed or shown on a mobile device, so long as it matches the patron ID
