Through newspaper clippings, photographs, programs, brochures, and other items, the scrapbooks document the history, activities, people, and events of the group from 1965 to 2014.

Biographical Note

Phi Sigma Alpha, a corollary of Beta Sigma Phi, is a non-academic and non-political sorority that was originally founded in Corona, California, in 1960. The Rochester, Minnesota, chapter formed in 1965 and is called Minnesota Gamma. A *Rochester Post Bulletin* article from October 2, 1965, described the organization as "an international sorority for women interested in a better understanding of human relations."
